



TIGHTS OR LEGGINGS

May be worn
under shorts
or skirts.



PANTS

- Pants may be tan (khaki), navy or black.
- Pants shall have no pockets stitched on the outside.
- Pants cannot have any holes or frays
- Pants (and shorts) must be worn at waist level.

SHORTS, SKIRTS, DRESSES

- Shorts may be tan (khaki), navy or black. Skirts may be tan, navy, black, or Clear Blue Plaid.
- Shorts or skirts may have inside pockets but no pockets stitched on the outside, including cargo-style pants.
- Shorts and skirts will be no shorter than 3" above the knees.
- No undergarments are to be visible above shorts, pants, or skirt waistline or below shorts, pants, or skirt hem.



SHIRTS, TOPS

- A solid-color polo or button-down shirt (up to a 1 inch pocket logo) must be worn every day.
- A solid-color long-sleeve or short-sleeve shirt may be worn under the polo or button-down shirt.
- A solid-color sweatshirt or sweater (up to a 1 inch pocket logo) may be worn over the polo or button-down shirt.
- A spirit-wear sweatshirt may be worn over the polo or button-down shirt.
- Spirit-wear t-shirts may be worn on Fridays in place of the polo or oxford shirt.

OUTERWEAR

- hoodies (no writing, small brand logo only), pullover sweaters, crewneck sweatshirts, cardigans, fleece, sweater vests, official RLS sweatshirts and class sweatshirts, and single solid-color pullovers.

SHOES

- Closed-toe shoes must be worn at all times. Shoes cannot be made from foam-based material.
- Athletic shoes are required for Physical Education class.

Our standardized dress guidelines are intended to foster a learning environment where students focus on their education without unnecessary distractions related to appearance. Neatness, modesty, and simplicity are values that reflect our Christian faith and help create a respectful school community. We ask all students and families to support these expectations as part of our shared commitment to the mission and values of our school.

Shirts, Tops:

- A solid-color polo or button-down shirt (up to a 1 inch pocket logo) must be worn every day.
- A solid-color long-sleeve or short-sleeve shirt may be worn under the polo or button-down shirt.
- A solid-color sweatshirt or sweater (up to a 1 inch pocket logo) may be worn over the polo or button-down shirt.
- A spirit-wear sweatshirt may be worn over the polo or button-down shirt.
- Spirit-wear t-shirts may be worn on Fridays in place of the polo or oxford shirt.
- Tops must fit appropriately so that the stomach area or upper torso are never exposed, even when arms are raised.

Shorts, Skirts, Dresses:

- Shorts may be tan (khaki), navy or black. Skirts may be tan, navy, black, or Clear Blue Plaid.
- Shorts or skirts may have inside pockets but no pockets stitched on the outside, including cargo-style pants.
- Tights or leggings may be worn under shorts or skirts. Leggings are defined as:
close-fitting stretch pants that fit snugly from the waist to the ankle and are not classified as sweatpants, joggers, flared pants, or athletic warm-up pants.
- *Shorts and skirts will be no shorter than 3" above the knees.*
- *No undergarments are to be visible above shorts, pants, or skirt waistline or below shorts, pants, or skirt hem.*

Pants:

- Pants may be tan (khaki), navy or black.
- Pants shall have no pockets stitched on the outside.
- Pants cannot have any holes or frays.
- Pants (and shorts) must be worn at waist level.

Shoes:

- Closed-toe shoes must be worn at all times. Shoes must stay on students' feet.
- Shoes cannot be made from foam-based material.
- Athletic shoes are required for Physical Education class.

Head:

- Hair should be kept neat and away from eyes.
- Hair color must remain within natural human shades of hair color (no stripes of color, color around the neckline or colors hidden underneath). This includes hair extensions.
- Hats, caps, any headwear, headphones, sweatbands, or sunglasses (unless specified by a doctor) will not be worn during school hours.
- Hoods are not to be worn in school at any time.

Outerwear:

For school purposes, the following garments are always considered outerwear and must always be worn over a polo or button-down:

- hoodies (no writing, small brand logo only), pullover sweaters, crewneck sweatshirts, cardigans, fleece, sweater vests, official RLS sweatshirts and class sweatshirts, and single solid-color pullovers.
- RLS Spiritwear shirts may be worn on Fridays instead of a collared shirt.

Other:

- No visible body piercings other than the ear piercing and nose studs is allowed.
(ie. No nose rings, septum rings, gauges. etc.)
- No clothing shall have writing other than the logo.

Sports Teams:

If approved by the coach, teams are allowed to wear their “tops” during home games (as advertisements that a game is happening) but school “bottoms” will remain in school dress code. The entire team needs to be participating, not just a few athletes. Due to the limited number of games, football teams may wear their jersey tops for away games as well. (*At a coach's discretion, a team may choose to instead dress up (ie. shirts and ties) to promote home games.)

PE Uniforms:

- RLS students enrolled in a physical education class will be required to purchase and wear PE clothing as approved by the school.

Purchase:

- Standardized dress may be purchased anywhere as long as they meet the above standards.

Dress Code Administration:

- The dress code is in effect at all times when in the building during school hours even if the student has late arrival or early dismissal.
- For a school-sponsored off-campus activity (ie. field trips, etc), the school dress code is in effect unless otherwise specifically stated by the trip sponsor.
- Students attending school events (ie. games/plays, etc) as spectators are exempt from wearing standardized dress, but are still expected to dress in Christian modesty.
- School administration reserves the right to determine what is appropriate.
- When there are infractions, see Expected Standard of Conduct. Repeated dress code violations are considered Level 2 offenses.
